Lions International – ROAR 2017

As part of an initiative to promote a more youthful image, the Lions SE Foundation has launched a new competition for KS2 children in conjunction with the IT company, 7 billion IDEAS. Weyfield was especially chosen by Guildford Lions and the purpose of the competition is to improve creativity by developing an idea that could change the world.

Last Friday our budding inventors presented their projects to a panel from Guildford Lions, explaining their ideas from rubbish-guzzling seagoing vessels to protective layers around the Earth.

The panel was very impressed with the children’s ideas and the way they presented them. They particularly liked that the Food Flavour Spray, which could change the taste of food, was not just for faddy eaters, but could give people who are allergic to certain foods the means to have the taste they crave; the Freestyle Project, a contraption that straps to the user’s thigh, can help you control diabetes by checking blood sugar and giving you insulin, and was devised as one of the children is diabetic. The project that will go forward to the final, however, is Remember Dementia, which, again, impacted on the panel as it personally affects the family of one of its creators – and it fits in with the work the Lions are already doing with dementia. It can be a phone app or on an electronic item of jewellery, which gives reminders about medication, appointments, etc. Of course, the elephant logo is because an elephant never forgets!



We’re Going on a Gruffalo Hunt...

On Tuesday, Reception bravely went to the woods in the hope (or not!) of finding a gruffalo, the menacing creature from the book by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler.

Like all good detectives, they took tools to help them in their quest – binoculars and magnifying glasses – and they found plenty of evidence that a gruffalo had, indeed, been there: footprints, orange eyes, brown fur and purple prickles. If all that didn’t point to a gruffalo then I don’t know what does! In addition, they found the broken house of a snake – poor snake – and some white feathers on the ground; oh no! They were shocked! Not the owls...?

Many things that should be found in a wood were detected: leaves, some still green, others orange, yellow or brown; birds’ nests high in the trees; fallen branches; mushrooms; but the children were also sad to find things that shouldn’t have been there: an old black rubbish bag, a plastic bottle and discarded crisp packets and burger boxes.
