Stars of the Week





It has been wonderful seeing all our pupils and families again this week and I'm pleased to say that 2018 has started with a whirlwind of activity at Weyfield, which you can read about in this newsletter! All the children have come back excited to learn and I thank you in advance for the support I know you will give them as parents as we move through the year.

This week I wanted to share with you one example of how our pupils strive to put Weyfield's personal goals into action. As I walked past Miss Ruocco's classroom earlier this week, I noticed some letters had been pinned to the windows. The letters were addressed to the pupils in Maple class (Y4) and signed from various members of the Sutton police force. Miss Ruocco explained that at the end of last term, Maple class had a discussion about all the people who would be working over Christmas – to look after others, keep us safe and keep the country moving. As a class, they decided to write letters to thank these people for their hard work and wish them a Merry Christmas. Our pupils wrote letters to members of the police, the army and nurses. International Weyfield

Did you realise that, at the last count, we have children here at Weyfield who speak a staggering **25 different languages** – plus English! (Not to mention the staff.) For many, their days at school are spent communicating in a different language from the one they use at home; how amazing is that? We shall be meeting some of our polyglots in this space over the coming weeks...

Ishmael, who is now in Year 4, joined Weyfield in Year 2 and spoke no English at all when he arrived from Spain. He still speaks Spanish at home and one of the reasons his family came to the UK was that his mother particularly wanted him to learn to speak English fluently. He says he was quite afraid when he was first here as he didn't understand what was going on and he couldn't communicate with anyone, but the other children – and in particular, Jordon – helped him to pick up the language just by talking to him. He feels he still has some way to go to be able to speak fluent English, but is certainly able to communicate with both his friends and the staff, and has even been able to help us by translating for other Spanish-speaking children! He tells us, «Me gusta estar en Weyfield».
