I'll Huff and I'll Puff...

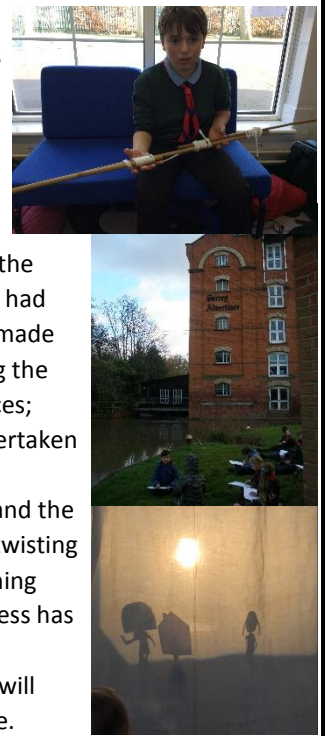
This week Cedar Class have been combining their T4W text 'The Three Little Pigs' with science. They have been taking part in the 'Big Bad Wolf Huff and Puff' science experiment. Predictions were made as to whether various everyday objects such as an apple, a feather, a football, a packet of crisps, a wooden block, a scarf, a stone and a metal toy car could be moved by huffing and puffing them.

The children looked carefully at what each object was made of before making their predictions. To make it a fair experiment, they used an electric air pump. It was great fun watching each item to see if it would move and recording the outcome. There were some very logical predictions and observations and also some surprising results!



Scouting Activities

As reported last week, our Cubs have begun to work on their activity badges. Those children who are hoping to be awarded an Artist badge visited the river to sketch the scene there before refining their work over the coming weeks; the Entertainers had already chosen a fairy tale and made shadow puppets before treating the rest of the group to performances; goal-shooting practice was undertaken by those completing Physical Recreation (currently football) and the Pioneers were making rope by twisting twine and then tying up everything that didn't move! International Weyfield

Hindi-speaking Lavanya, in Year 5, came to England from Delhi in India 2 years ago with what she calls 'basic English'. She now speaks English fluently, aided by her friends at Weyfield and a love of reading. Her family speaks English at home and she only really needs Hindi if she travels back to India to visit her relations there.

Lavanya says she now speaks English better than Hindi and, although she can speak the language, she can no longer read it or write it. She had arrived here able to 'read and write' in her mother language (at a level expected of a young child) but, as she no longer needs to read or write in the language, she has forgotten much of what she knew.
