## From Miss Lim

This week I have had the pleasure of meeting lots of new parents, whose children have been allocated a place at Weyfield in Reception for September 2018. I always offer new parents a tour of the school, so they can see it in action for themselves. All the parents were rightly impressed with the pupils' excellent behaviour, their focus in lessons and the quality of work in their books. Year 1 were kind enough to give some parents a quick 'Talk for Writing' performance, even though they had only started learning their new text, *Cinderella*, the day before! They performed with such confidence and used fantastic expression. Of course, it's not only new parents that I'm keen to show the school off to – you are always welcome to pop in and see what's going on, just speak to myself or Ms Hook and we'd love to take you round.

Mrs Mankel, Literacy Lead and Y3 Class Teacher, was keen to share Sammy's work with me this week, as an example of the huge impact Talk for Writing is having on the quality of pupils' writing. The children were given a picture and asked to write a description with a specific focus on using adjectives to create an atmosphere:

*I looked over the bay and saw a small rocky island. The weather was fine so I explored it. I was walking up a steep cliff using my hands and feet in little mossy handholds in the cliff. I noticed the sea was a bit uneasy because there was a storm coming closer and closer. I decided I should spend the rest of my time on the ruined castle in the small but rocky island. The tremendous pointed towers touched the gleam of the sun. The unstable walls were slowly crumbling down to the sandy shore.*

I'm sure you'll agree with me that Sammy has done a fantastic job and I'm just sorry there isn't space to share all the other children's great writing with you... why not come into school and see more for yourself?

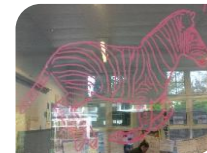
## Smartie Challenge
