### Year 3

Year 3 have had an extremely busy week, first attending a Singing Picnic at Surrey Sports Park on Monday, along with 4 other schools.

The children had been rehearsing long and hard for the day and performed their song, "First The Little Roots Grow" with great enthusiasm. They also learnt some new singing games, including "here Comes Sally".

The children had a fantastic time and wished the event could have been longer!

Then on Tuesday, after having seen a video of children in Ethiopia having to walk 8 miles carrying water in order to have water in their village, the children all tried carrying 4 litres of water round the field 4 times. While they all managed it, they agreed they would not like to have to do this every day! They also made a contribution to Water Aid, which works in 34 countries across the world, to provide clean water and improved hygiene.
