

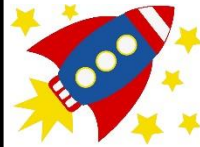

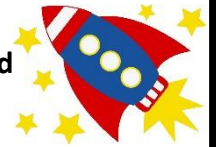

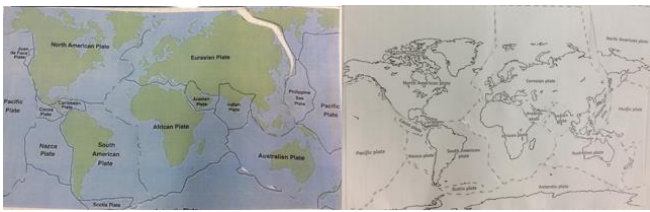

Active Planet

Year 2 have been discovering how different the Earth was 250 million years ago, as well as finding out about the two theories for how these changes happened: continental drift and plate tectonics. The continental drift theory states that the continents were once parts of a supercontinent called Pangaea and the continents 'drifted apart'. The plate tectonics theory is based on the continental drift theory but explains that the continents drifted apart because of the constant interaction between the earth's tectonic plates and the heat of the earth's core.

This movement is still going on today. The continents move between 1 and 10cm a year; South America is moving towards North America, while North America is moving away from Europe, and Australasia is moving towards Asia. The children were fascinated to watch a video of Iceland, where they could actually see the ground moving!

Some of the children found this work quite challenging, but described it as 'interesting' and 'amazing' and said they had definitely learnt something new. They are looking forward to finding out about – and making – volcanoes!



New Year, New Class

Mrs Merrin has loved her first week in Elm Class! Elm have been exploring shapes in maths, and even used dice to help them with their addition.

In Literacy, the children have been looking at thank you notes and are preparing to produce a final piece of writing.

The children have also been outside collecting leaves to create a nature picture for their IPC topic. We can't wait to see it!

Congratulations to Lavender Class, who have the highest attendance this week of **99.63%**; they will be awarded golden time. This week's **whole-school attendance** is only **93%**. Good attendance is essential to support learning and to ensure children have good relationships in school. While we understand that there are occasions when children are genuinely unwell and unable to attend, we expect attendance to be above 96%.

Programmers of the Future

We are delighted now to be making full use of our IT Suite.

Here, Year 4 are learning the principles of block coding, using this to devise a game where they burst balloons, which are floating on the screen. They have learnt that, for a program to work, they have to give it clear



instructions and have been introduced to the fact that programs respond to inputs to do different things... If they hadn't instructed it to pop the balloon when they clicked, they would be (and sometimes were) clicking away in vain while their balloons floated away!

The children will go on to develop these skills, using other forms of code, at the same time learning to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly.

We are sure that many of them will go on to be the technology experts of the future!
