



### Behaviour Policy

Please find enclosed a copy of our new behaviour policy. I am delighted to say that almost all of our children behaved impeccably almost all of the time. This is why we have introduced a number of rewards that children may receive; either individually or earned as a group. We had our first Celebration Assembly on Friday and it was an absolute pleasure to share the many successes with the pupils and staff. As with many aspects of child development, guidance on making the best behaviour choices are sometimes needed. Like the rewards, we have a number of sanctions in place to help remind children of good behaviour choices. Please read the policy carefully. We hope that you will find it useful when talking to your child at home about any rewards or sanctions that occur. The behaviour policy replaces any existing policy and there are no additional sanctions in place.

Thank you to the parents who have contacted me regarding some inconsistent class rules that were occurring. As part of our policy change, we have now reviewed all classroom procedures and will all be consistently following our new policy.
