In scorching temperatures, all our children competed with great passion and enthusiasm, showing great sportsmanship, cheering on their team-mates and congratulating all the winners.



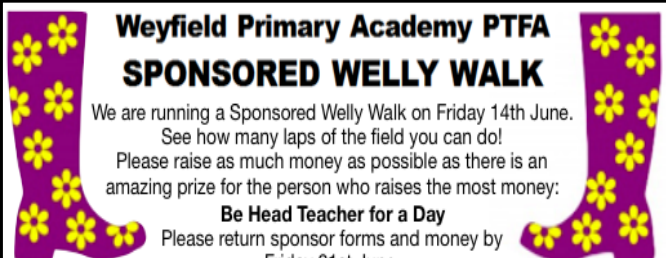
A special mention must go to William, who won two bronze medals!

### WEYFIELD PTFA SUMMER FAIR RAFFLE TICKETS

#### Fiver Challenge

Our Year 6 children have begun work on this year's Fiver Challenge, which is a national initiative, supported by *Young Enterprise and Young Money*, whose mission is to "give young people the life skills, knowledge and confidence they need to succeed in the changing world of work... empowering them to discover, develop and celebrate their skills and potential".

Each child is loaned £5 and they will work, usually in groups, to provide a product or service, having to put together a business plan, research their product, source and/or make merchandise, produce advertising materials, etc., ready for the actual event, which will be coming up in a few weeks' time (more details to follow).

The work the children undertake provides a practical learning context which supports the National Curriculum in PSHE, Mathematics and English.

After the event, each £5 loan is repaid and the profit will be spent on Year 6's end-of-year treat which, it has been decided, will be a trip and/or activity this year.

The children are very much looking forward to welcoming parents and families to their Fiver Challenge Fair, which promises to be a great event!



**Congratulations to Aneira**, who has been given a special **Challenge Reader** award for achieving over 100 Challenge Book points in Accelerated Reader quizzes.



Accelerated Reader, which we introduced in 2015, allows children to take a quiz after they have read an Accelerated Reader book (which many of our books are) to demonstrate their understanding of what they have read, and gives their teacher an insight into their reading activity and where their strengths and weaknesses lie. As a school, we introduced Challenge Books to try and encourage our readers to **challenge themselves** by reading more demanding texts.

As a school, since September, our children have read 8,855,116 words and counting!
